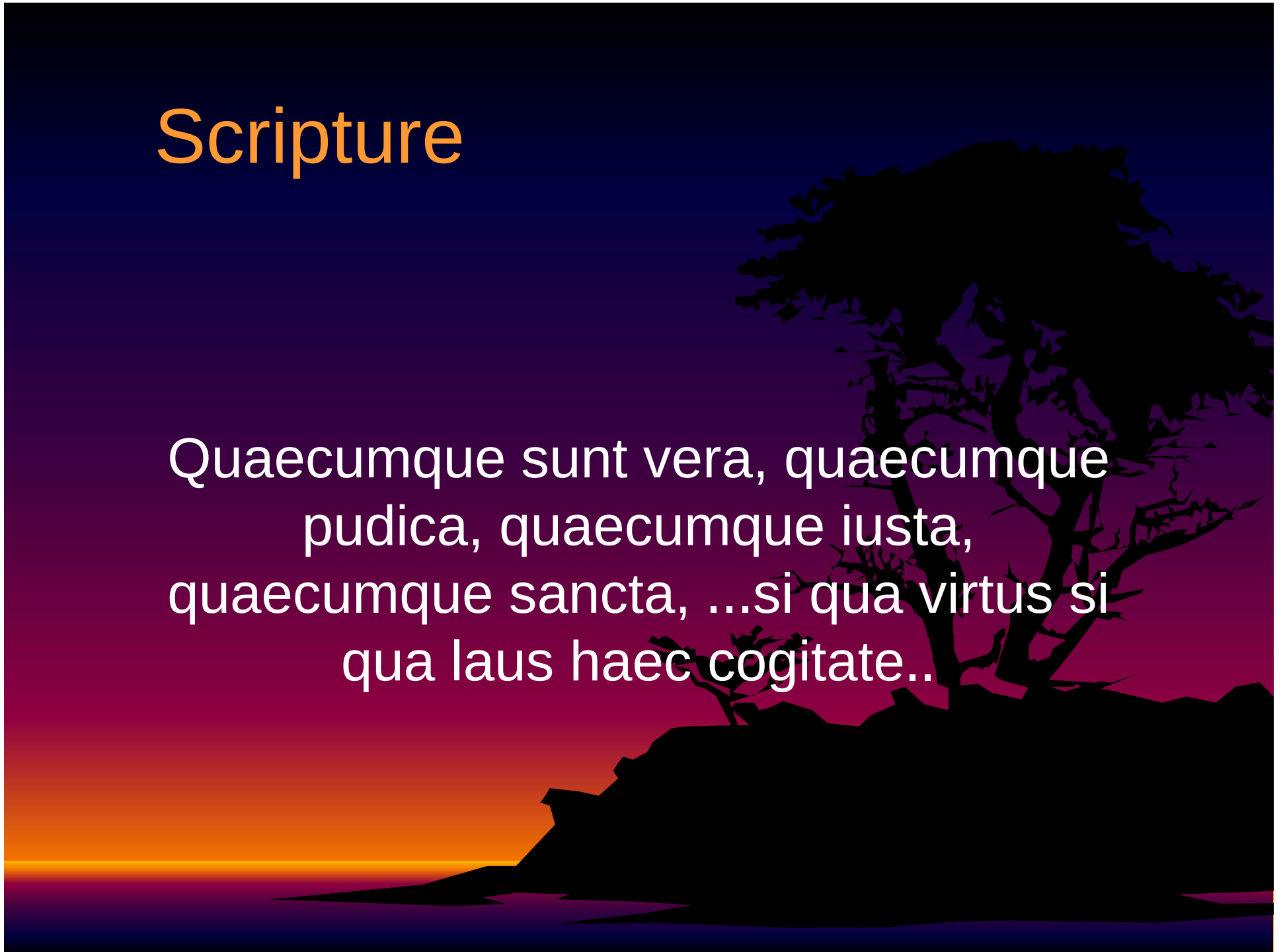

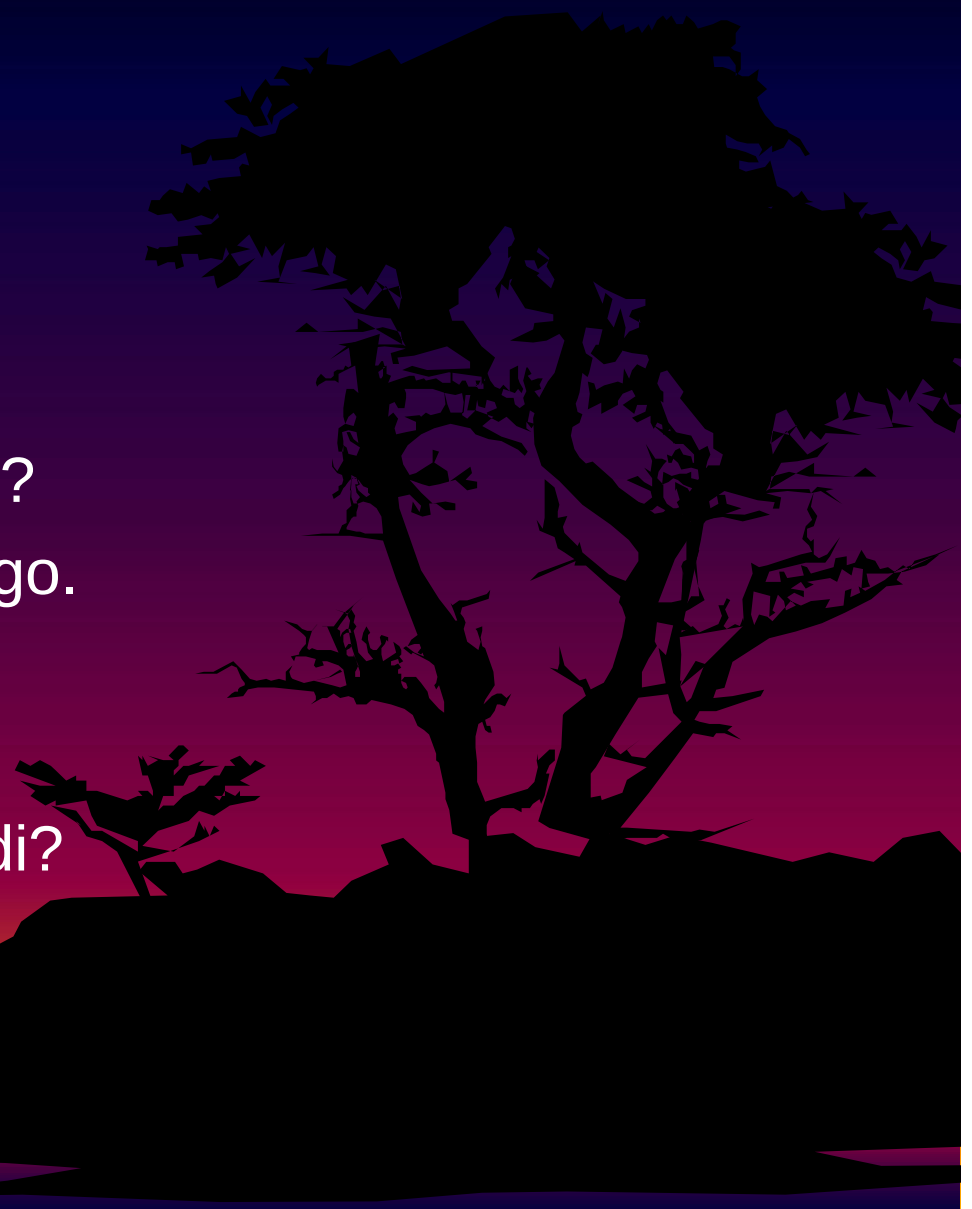

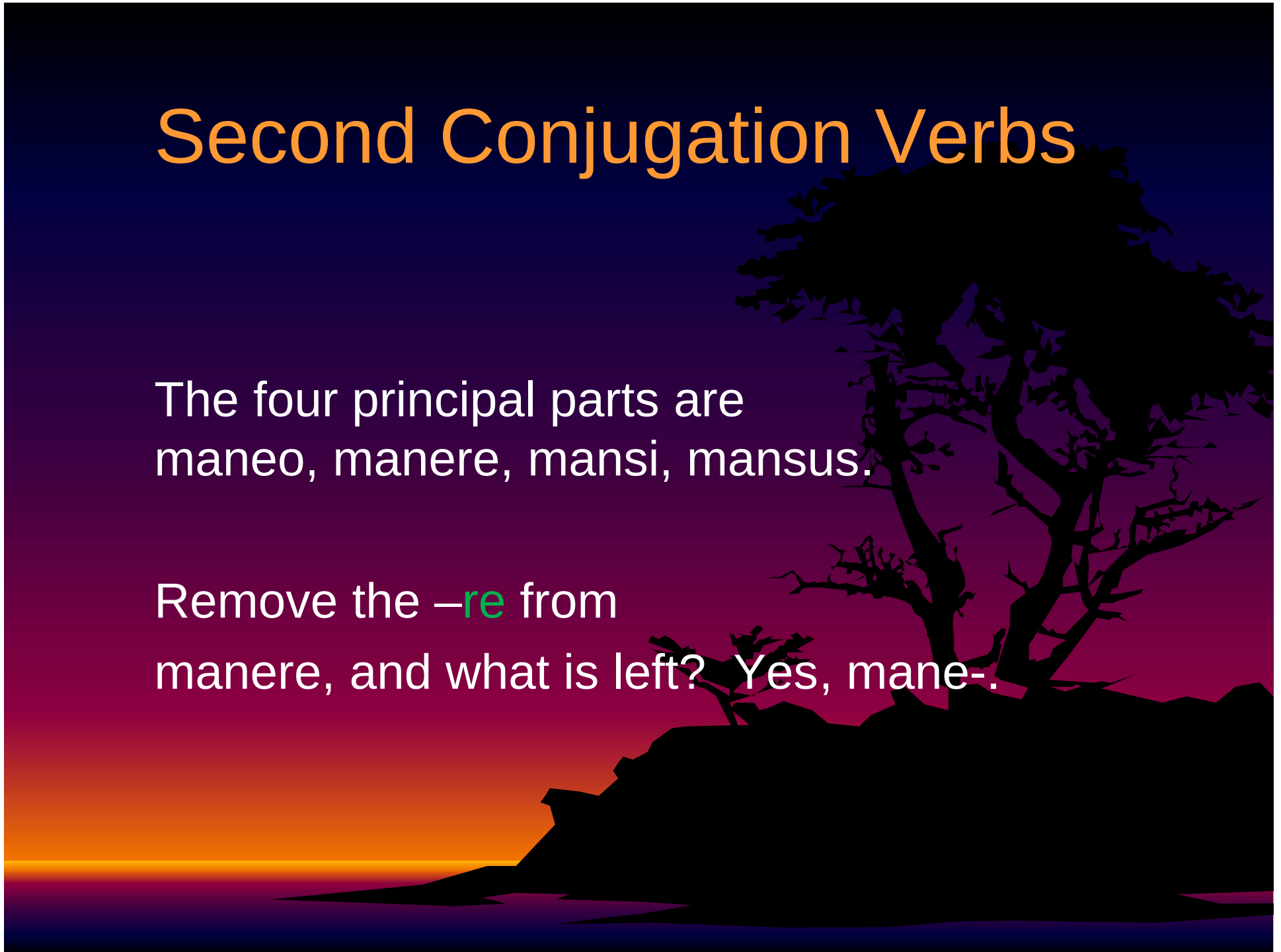

# Second Conjugation Form

## SINGULAR

maneo, *I remain, stay*

manes, *you remain, stay*

manet, *he, she, it remains,  
stays*

## PLURAL

manemus, *we remain,  
stay*

manetis, *you (all) remain,  
stay*

manent, *they remain, stay*

Cives fiebant iratissimi et misit Coriolanum ex oppido.

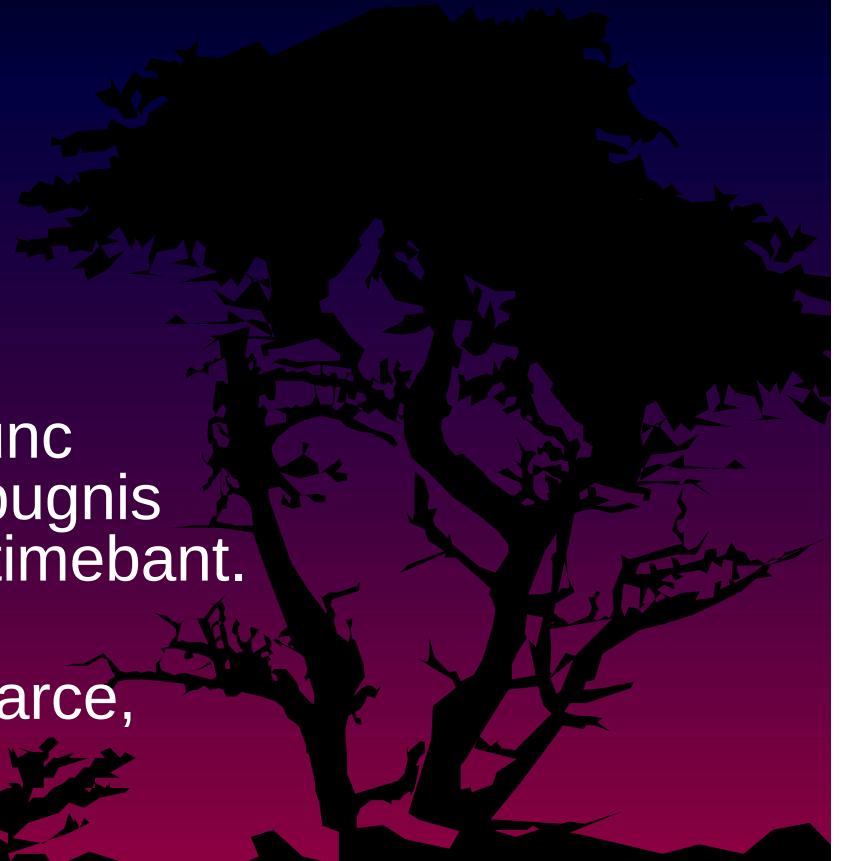


# Chapter 16

# Princeps Fidelium Vocat

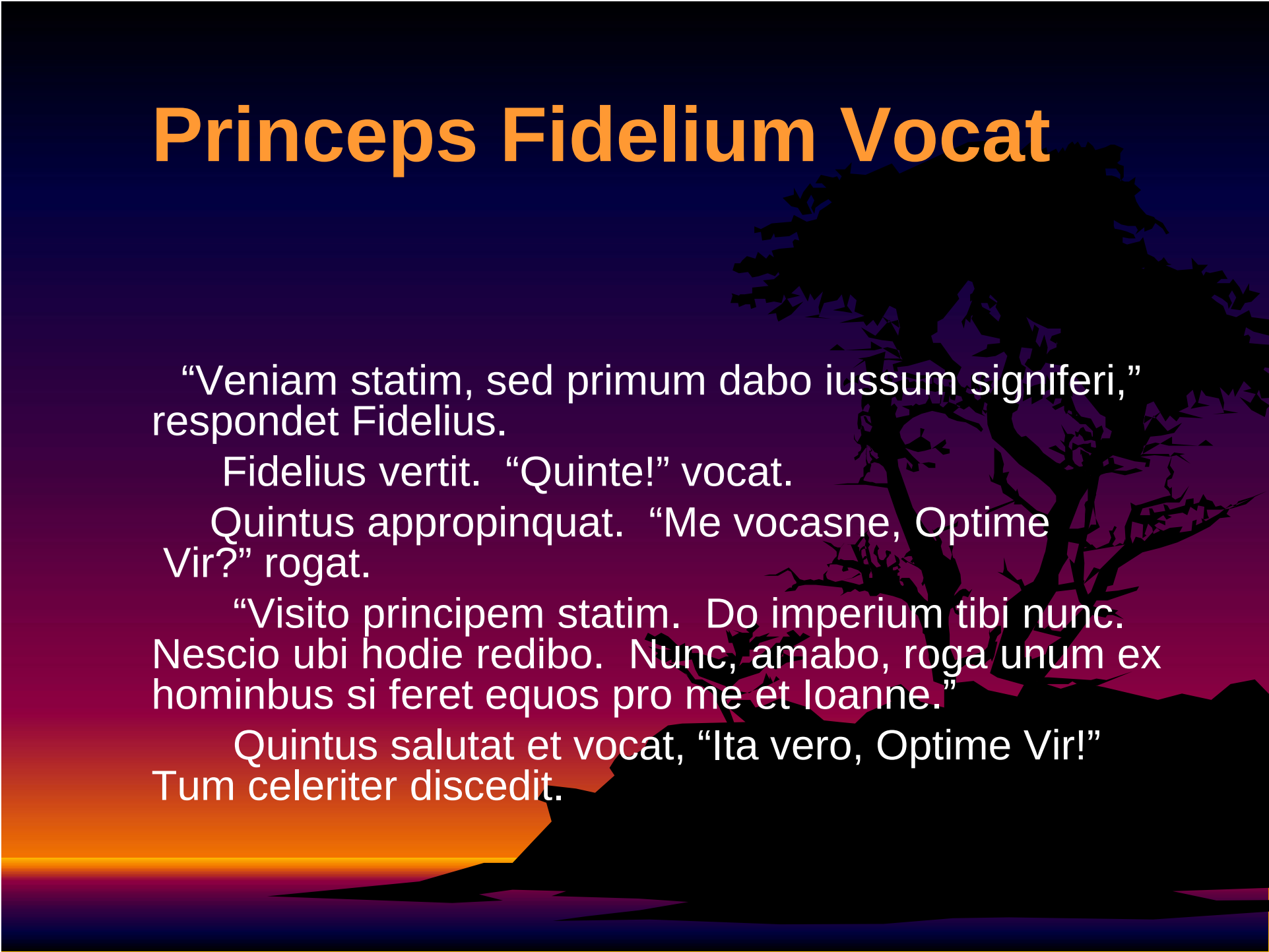
