Give the English meaning of each noun, and, using your list of rules for i-stems, tell which rule governs the i-stem noun. (If you haven't learned the word yet, then the meanings are done for you.) If it is NOT an i-stem, write NO in place of the rule number.

civis, civis	citizen	1
mare, maris	sea	4
mens, mentis	mind	2
arx, arcis	citadel	3
finis, finis	end, boundary	1
nox, noctis	night	3
canalis, canalis	channel of a river	1
caedes, caedis	murder	1
cohors, cohortis	staff, crowd, cohort	2
cor, cordis	heart	NO (It is a neuter noun and does not end in -al, -ar or -e.)
urbs, urbis	city	3
faux, faucis	throat	NO, Rule 3 states that the base must end in two consonants.
mors, mortis	death	2
hypocrisis, hypocrisis	hypocrisy	1
parens, parentis	parent	2
turris, turris	tower	1
rais, rais	raft	1
contubernalis, contubernalis	staff member/officer	1
strages, stragis	havoc, slaughter, massacre	1
hostis, hostis	enemy	1
pons, pontis	bridge	2
panis, panis	bread	1
ignis, ignis	fire	1
dux, ducis	leader	NO, Rule 3 states that the base must end in two consonants.
